

INDIGENOUS PLANTS IN FLOWER - OCTOBER

| <u>Scientific name</u> | <u>Common name</u> | <u>Brief description</u> |
|----------------------------------|---------------------------|---|
| <i>Acacia mucronata</i> | (caterpillar wattle) | narrow leaf, spike of yellow flowers |
| <i>Acacia melanoxylon</i> | (blackwood) | broader leaf, flowers in spherical heads |
| <i>Acrotriche serrulata</i> | (ants delight) | prickly ground cover, green flowers underneath |
| <i>Beyeria viscosa</i> | (pinkwood) | separate male and female plants, 3-lobed fruit |
| <i>Bulbine sp</i> | bulbine lily | spike of yellow flowers |
| <i>Clematis clitoroides</i> | pleasant clematis | climber with large white flowers |
| <i>Epacris exserta</i> | (south esk heath) | very rare Tasmanian Endemic |
| <i>Euryomyrtis ramosissima</i> | (heath myrtle) | white/pink flowers, ground cover |
| <i>Goodia lotifolia</i> | (smooth goldentip) | bright yellow pea flowers, Shrub. |
| <i>Grevillea australis</i> | (grevillea) | profuse flowering shrub to about 1m tall |
| <i>Hibbertia riparia</i> | (erect guinea flower) | bright yellow 5-petal flowers |
| <i>Indigofera australis</i> | (native indigo) | violet peaflowered shrub) |
| <i>Leucopogon collinus</i> | (white beard heath) | tufts of tiny white flowers with fluffy petals |
| <i>Lomandra longifolia</i> | (sagg) | strappy leaves with "chewed" ends |
| <i>Micrantheum hexandrum</i> | (river trident bush) | separate male and female plants, small yellow flowers |
| <i>Nematolepis squamea</i> | (satinwood) | shrub to 2m, white flowers |
| <i>Olearia phlogopappa</i> | (dusty daisybush) | white daisy flowers on shrub between bridges |
| <i>Pelargonium australe</i> | (southern storksbill) | native pelargonium, in rock crevices, pink flowers |
| <i>Pimelia nivea</i> | (bushmans bootlace) | tall shrub with white flowerhead & round leaves |
| <i>Pomaderris pilifera</i> | (hairy dogwood) | yellow flower buds |
| <i>Prostanthera rotundifolia</i> | round leaf mintbush | purple flowering shrub |
| <i>Pterostylis pedunculata</i> | (maroonhood) | green orchid on top of boulders in wet places |
| <i>Spyridium vexilliferum</i> | (helicopter bush) | tiny flower heads surrounded by white bracts |
| <i>Spyridium ulicinum</i> | (scented dusty miller) | Tasmanian Endemic, white flowers, shrub to 1m |
| <i>Stackhousia monogyna</i> | forest candles | herb with candle-like spikes of flowers |
| <i>Thysanotus patersonii</i> | fringed lily | Trailing/twining purple flowered plant |

| <i>Bursaria spinosa</i> | (prickly box) | distinctive "purses" (seed cases) |
| <i>Callistemon pallidus</i> | (yellow bottlebrush) | hard fruit along stem in groups |
| <i>Callitris oblonga</i> | south esk pine | conifer. Subspecies oblonga is endemic to Tasmania |
| <i>Cassytha melantha</i> | (dodder) | "monkey twine", parasitic on other plants |
| <i>Eucalyptus amygdalina</i> | (black peppermint) | Tasmanian Endemic, narrow leaves |
| <i>Exocarpos cupressiformis</i> | (native cherry) | edible fruit stalk |
| <i>Lomatia tinctoria</i> | (guitar plant) | interesting fruit (mandolin shaped) and beautiful flower |
| <i>Melaleuca ericifolia</i> | (paperbark) | white papery bark, profuse white flowers in summer |
| <i>Notelaea ligustrina</i> | (native olive) | opposite lance-shaped leaves, flowers not often seen |
| <i>Pomaderris apetala</i> | (common dogwood) | rough leaves, bunches of flower buds |
