<u>Allocasuarina verticillata</u>	drooping sheoak	needle-like "leaves" (branchlets); fruit like pine cones.	
<u>Bedfordia salicina</u>	tasmanian blanket bush	small tree; yellow daisy flowers	link
<u>Beyeria viscosa</u>	pinkwood	small tree; inconspicuous flower; female plants have 3-lobed fruit	
<u>Bulbine glauca</u>	bulbine lily	herb; soft hollow leaves; spike of yellow flowers	link
<u>Bursaria spinosa</u>	prickly box	small tree; distinctive "purses" (seed cases)	
<u>Callitris oblonga</u>	south esk pine	tree; conifer;	link
<u>Calytrix tetragona</u>	fringe myrtle	shrub; star-like white flowers	
<u>Cassytha melantha</u>	large dodderlaurel	"monkey twine", parasitic on other plants	
<u>Dianella revoluta</u>	spreading flaxlily	strap-like leaves; blue & yellow flowers; blue berries	
<u>Diplarrena moraea</u>	white flagiris	strap-like leaves; white flowers	link
<u>Epacris exserta (t)</u>	southesk heath	shrub; white tube flowers; small flat sharply pointed leaves	
<u>Eucalyptus amygdalina (e)</u>	black peppermint	tree; narrow leaves	
<u>Exocarpos cupressiformis</u>	native cherry	tree; conifer-like foliage; edible orange coloured fruit	
<u>Hakea microcarpa</u>	small fruit needlebush	sharp needle-like leaves, white flowers, small woody fruits	
<u>Hibbertia riparia</u>	erect guineaflower	shrub; golden flowers	link
<u>Lomandra longifolia</u>	sagg	strap-like leaves; yellow/brown flower spikes	
<u>Lomatia tinctoria (e)</u>	guitar plant	shrub; divided leaves; white flowers	
<u>Melaleuca pallida</u>	yellow bottlebrush	shrub; yellow bottlebrush flower spike & hard fruit along stem	
<u>Melaleuca ericifolia</u>	paperbark	tree; white papery bark, profuse white flowers in summer	
<u>Mentha australis (t)</u>	river mint	herb; strong peppering aroma; threatened species	
<u>Micranthemum hexandrum</u>	river trident bush	tiny yellow flowers; leaf with three leaflets	
<u>Notelaea ligustrina</u>	native olive	small tree; small green to purple fruit	
<u>Pelargonium australe</u>	southern storksbill	native pelargonium, in rock crevices, pink flowers	
<u>Persicaria subsessilis</u>	bristly waterpepper	edge of Basin; listed as "endangered"	
<u>Pimelia nivea</u>	bushmans bootlace	tall shrub with white flowerhead & round leaves	link
<u>Pomaderris apetala</u>	common dogwood	small tree; rough leaves; flowers with no petals	
<u>Prostanthera rotundifolia (t)</u>	roundleaf mintbush	shrub; round leaves; masses of purple flowers	
<u>Schoenoplecton tabernaemontani</u>	river clubsedge	rush at edge of First Basin	

Senecio	campylocarpus	bulging fireweed	small yellow flower heads; listed as "vulnerable"
Senecio	quadridentatus	cotton fireweed	greyish, hairy herb with small daisy-like flower heads
Solanum	laciniatum	kangaroo apple	shrub; lobed leaves; large purple flowers; yellow/orange fruit
Spyridium	vexilliferum (t)	helicopter bush	shrub; tiny flower heads surrounded by white bracts
Stylidium	graminifolium	trigger plant	strap-like leaves; spike of pink flowers

FERNS

Adiantum	aethiopicum	maidenhair fern	delicate plant with fan-shaped leaves
Blechnum	nudum	soft water fern	light green; fronds divided only once
Cheilanthes	austrotenuifolia	rock fern	resurrection fern
Dicksonia	antarctica	tree fern	trunks to several metres tall
Microsorium	pustulatum	kangaroo fern	growing on trunks of other plants or rocks
Polystichum	proliferum	mother shield fern	note bulbils (new ferns) on fronds
